

Dr. Esther Sanyé-Mengual is a Marie Skłodowska-Curie fellow at the Research centre in urban environment for agriculture and biodiversity (REScue-AB) of the Department of Agricultural Sciences (Alma Mater Studiorum-Università di Bologna, Italy). She holds a PhD in Environmental Sciences and Technology, a MSc in Environmental Studies (esp. industrial ecology), a BSc in Environmental Sciences (2010) and a BSc in Urban planning and Geography (2017) from the Universitat Autònoma of Barcelona (Catalonia). Her research interests are the quantitative assessment of sustainability (including its three dimensions: environment, society and economy) and the production and consumption of food in urban areas. These pathways merged in the design and implementation of interdisciplinary schemes to evaluate the sustainability of urban agriculture. While her PhD thesis focused on rooftop agriculture, her on-going project SustUrbanFoods evaluates urban agriculture as a whole, paying attention to social and technological innovations. She has developed her academic career in Catalonia, Italy, Switzerland and Germany, combining projects in universities and SMEs. With several peer-reviewed scientific publications on the topic, she is currently a guest editor for two special issues on urban agriculture of "Sustainability" (MDPI).
